Not Acceptable

Follow Guidelines Carefully

NO NEED TO REMOVE:
Paper clips, stamps, address labels, staples, metal fasteners, cellophane address windows, rubber bands, spiral bindings, plastic tabs

Newspapers, brochures & inserts
(no plastic bags, do not tie & bundle)

NO NEED TO REMOVE:
Paper clips, stamps, address labels, staples, metal fasteners, cellophane address windows, rubber bands, spiral bindings, plastic tabs

- Please flatten all cardboard boxes.
- Empty and rinse all containers.
- Put all shredded paper into plastic bags (preferably clear), and tie bags securely. Don't use paper bags for shredded paper. Don't shred more paper than necessary. Shred confidential information only.
- Collection container size is limited to 32 gallons (50 lbs). Use more than one container if necessary.

- No scrap metal
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No plastic bags
- No needles or syringes
- No window panes, mirrors, ceramics & Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

- **Clean Food Off Recyclables** Please wipe and clean all food off the recyclables prior to putting them into the recycling bin. This will help to keep everything clean, dry and bug-free.
- **Empty the Liquids** Please drain all liquids out of the recyclables prior to putting them into the recycling bin.
- **What About Bottle Caps?** Bottle caps fall through the screens and cracks in the single-stream recycling facility. You may place bottle caps back on empty bottles and place them in the recycling bin. Loose bottle caps should be placed in the garbage and not the recycling bin.
- **Are Pizza Boxes Recyclable?** Pizza boxes are acceptable if they are clean and without grease. From our experience, most pizza box tops will be recyclable. The bottom of the pizza box from a plain pizza pie that was delivered with wax paper between the pizza and box is likely to also be clean enough to be acceptable. A pepperoni pizza is likely to have greased up the bottom too much and would make the bottom of the pizza box non-recyclable. The wax paper from the pizza box is not recyclable and should be placed in the garbage. We wish it was an easy "Yes/No" answer, but it really depends on how much grease gets absorbed in the box and whether someone is willing to tear off the top from the bottom when the bottom is dirty but the top is clean.
