

Letter from the Mayor

This November 7th, there will be a referendum on the ballot regarding the use of Green Township Open Space Trust Funds. Currently, the Open Space Fund may only be expended on the acquisition of Open Space properties. The purpose of the referendum is to obtain approval to expand the permitted use of Open Space Funds to include the construction and maintenance of Open Space properties. For example, to allow monies in the Trust Fund to be used for the construction and future maintenance of the new Rail Trail, or maintenance of the EverGreen Trail in EverGreen Park. Passage of this referendum will not raise your taxes. It simply allows existing Open Space monies to be used not only for the acquisition of land but to help maintain existing Open Space properties. This referendum is supported by the full Township Committee and hope we can count on your support. "SPECIALIZED TRAINING FOR GREEN TOWNSHIP'S FIRST RESPONDERS"

Last month, Green Township's First Aid and Fire Department personnel received an orientation to the various components associated with a typical airplane that utilizes Trinca Airport. The goal of the training was to provide the First Responders a "hands on" experience to the various critical aircraft components that require specialized knowledge in the event of an emergency condition at Trinca Airport involving an airplane such as the one used for the training exercise. The training agenda was prepared by Township Management and developed into an instructional lecture by a member of the Trinca Airport Advisory Committee, Josh Weinstein. Weinstein, a founding member of the Trinca Airport Advisory Committee, is a licensed pilot and provided the valuable instruction to our dedicated First Responders. "Safe Care Cam" Program

On December 22, 2016, Attorney General Christopher Porrino and the Division of Consumer Affairs announced a new program designed to ensure that New Jersey residents who suspect their loved ones are being abused, mistreated, or neglected by unscrupulous home health care providers can have access to micro-surveillance cameras that can be easily hidden to detect abuse and protect patients. The "Safe Care Cam" Program makes these cameras available for free 30-day loans. To participate in the program, please follow these simple steps:

- 1. Call the Division of Consumer Affairs at either (973) 504-6375or (800) 242-5846. Follow voice prompts to a "Safe Care Cam" Program voicemail box and leave a message with your name and contact information.
- 2. A staff member will contact anyone who leaves a voicemail with further information about the program and to schedule an appointment to pick-up a camera at either the Division's Newark or Cherry Hill office, depending on what is more convenient to the program participant.
- 3. At this appointment, the program participant will be required to do the following:
 - Provide a copy of a driver's license or other official identification.
 - Provide contact information, including phone number, cell phone number, and address.
 - Sign a program contract, which sets forth the rules and obligations under the "Safe Care Cam" Program.
- 4. Additionally, at this appointment, a staff member will provide the program participant with a camera and an accompanying memory card. A brief training will be provided on how the camera works and how footage can be recorded, viewed, and saved.
- 5. The camera and memory card will be on loan for 30 days. Upon request, this loan can be extended for a longer period of time.



HOW ARE YOUR SEEDLINGS???

Fall is here and we are wondering how your seedlings are doing...Last spring we included instructions on how to take care of them and by now they should be at least 24 inches tall, 1 3/4 inches wide, have full foliage and a strong root connection. To get them through winter, they need to be exposed to cold temps, but not in exposed pots or the roots will freeze. Bury the pots up to the lip in an area where the soil drains well. Water a little if winter is dry and protect from strong winds. Good Luck!
