Protect against Mosquitos

The Asian tiger mosquito (ATM) is a small black mosquito with distinct white stripe markings and lays its eggs in water-filled containers not in swamps, ditches or marshes. They are persistent day time biters and are typically found in containers around homes. Unlike other container breeding mosquitoes, Asian tiger mosquitoes will use very small sources of water, such as bottle caps or sources of litter! ATM was first discovered in Sussex County in 2012 and has been a great concern for public health. Because this mosquito lives near humans and is a vector of many diseases, it poses as a great threat to the human population.

The Office of Mosquito Control and the Sussex County Clean Communities program encourages all Sussex County residents to help their communities by not littering and to reduce, reuse, and recycle! Please contact the Office of Mosquito Control, at 973-940-5225, to report piles of discarded tires or other accumulations of water-holding litter. By preventing and cleaning up litter, you are eliminating mosquito breeding habitats and reducing the risk of disease transmission in your town.

Other Ways to Prevent and Control:

DRAIN: Empty out water containers at least once a

week

·DRESS: Wear long sleeves, long pants, and

light colored, loose-fitting clothing

·DEFEND: Properly apply an EPA approved repellent

We congratulate all of our applicants and wish them the best of luck in their future endeavors.



Where do your tax dollars go?

Muni. Purpose Local Tax & Open Space Tax indicates the percent of taxes that are utilized by the Municipality of Green Township. The Green Township Committee establishes the amount to be raised by taxes for this portion of total taxes.

County Taxes indicate the percent of taxes that are utilized by Sussex County. The Sussex County Freeholder Board establishes the amount to be raised by taxes for this portion of total taxes.

Local School Dist. indicates the percent of taxes that are utilized by the school district. The Green Township Board of Education establishes the amount to be raised by taxes for this portion of total taxes.

Black Bears 🕸



If encountering a black bear, the Division of Fish, Game and Wildlife has these tips:

- ▶Stay calm and use common sense. Never approach the animal. Most bears are easily frightened into leaving.
- ▶ Do not feed the bears! Bears that associate food with people may become aggressive and dangerous.
- ► Keep at least 15 feet away from the animal. If you are at close range, remain standing, avoid direct eye contact. Back up slowly and speak in a calm, assertive and assuring voice.
- ► Make sure the bear has an escape route. Sometimes bears will "bluff charge" when cornered. Yell, bang pots, or use an airhorn to scare the bear away. If the bear will not leave, move to your house, car or building if available. If a bear sounds a series of huffs or snaps or pops its jaws and swats the ground, it is a warning sign that you are too close. Slowly back away!
