RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF GREEN AND SUSSEX COUNTY HABITAT FOR HUMANITY FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING

WHEREAS, the Township of Green would like to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter "MOU") with Sussex County Habitat for Humanity to assist in its development of affordable housing as part of Green Township's Fair Share Housing Element and Fair Share Plan on two plots of land located within Green Township; and

WHEREAS, the properties to be developed by Sussex County Habitat for Humanity are Block 76, Lot 5, located at the corner of Decker Pond Road and Estell Way and Block 107, Lot 6, located at Crescent Road; and

WHEREAS, the Township will convey the above two plots of land in accordance with a schedule to be mutually agreed upon by both parties; and

WHEREAS, the Township will provide \$200,000.00 for each plot, with the monies to be provided from the Township affordable housing trust fund, for completion of affordable housing on the plots, in accordance with affordable housing requirements and in compliance with the MOU; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County Habitat for Humanity shall be responsible for all aspects of the developments on the plots, and shall ensure that the developments are in accordance with affordable housing laws and regulations, and shall deed restrict the properties as required; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County Habitat for Humanity understands that the Township shall have no obligations related to development of the affordable housing and no liabilities related to the housing constructed.

WHEREAS, this MOU will be in effect for a period of three (3) years from the date of signing.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, that the Township is hereby authorized to enter into a MOU with Sussex County Habitat for Humanity for the development of affordable housing for low and moderate income families.
