## MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK: Mr. Zschack noted the following matters:

**Executive Order 192** - Last week Governor Murphy issued Executive Order 192 establishing guidelines to protect workers. The Township has been following most of the protocols that are described in this order. Additional measures to be enacted are to include:

- Morning temperature and medical screening at the start of each shift. Touchless thermometers have been ordered.
- Additional cleaning of high-touch areas
- Additional fogging sanitization of municipal building and DPW garage

Bifurcate DPW - With the rise of COVID-19 cases in the state Mayor Phillips brought up the concern of how this could affect the Green Township workforce. The municipal building is configured with separate rooms which makes segregation of employees possible. The DPW is a different concern. If the DPW needs to quarantine we could potentially have a major issue keeping the roadways safe. We are working on a plan to separate the DPW in two teams. Three employees will be stationed at the DPW garage and two at the municipal building (in the downstairs activity room). These two teams will remain segregated at least for potentially the next four months. With this plan we hope to ensure that we will always have team members available to maintain the roads (as well as everything else needed).

A discussion ensued concerning the surge in COVID cases and consideration of closing the municipal building to the public, open by appointment only, eliminating the amount of public entering the building.

### MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY:

Mr. Conkling asked for an update regarding Tranquillity Farms. Mr. Zschack will follow-up with the County. Mr. Zschack reached out to the property owner with no return email.

Mrs. Raffay asked if the Rabies Clinic is scheduled for this weekend and asked if the Mayor and Deputy Mayor will be needed to help during the clinic. The Deputy Clerk will check with the Dog Licensing Official.

Mr. Conkling asked about the vacant property correspondence and zoning violation and what would be the follow-up. The Township Attorney explained that once notice of violation is sent, the next step would be to issue a summons. There will be appropriate follow-up.

MATTERS FROM THE MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENT HEAD: Mr. Perigo informed the Committee of the three trees that came down with the winds today. Damage was done to a portion of Whitehall Road due to a fire that started when the tree was down across the road.

MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY: Mrs. Leo noted no matters for discussion.

# TOWNSHIP OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

# AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A NEW NEPOTISM POLICY TO THE GREEN TOWNSHIP CODE

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Green has a Nepotism Policy as part of the Green Township Employee Handbook Policies and Procedures, adopted as Appendix E of the Green Township Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee desires to specifically adopt the Nepotism Policy as an ordinance and part of the Green Township Code;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of Green Township, Sussex County, New Jersey, that a new Section 2-56 shall be adopted as part of the Green Township Code, regarding the personal relationships and nepotism procedure, as set forth herein:

### **SECTION 1.**

A new Section 2-56 shall be adopted as follows:

# 2-56 PERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS AND NEPOTISM PROCEDURE

Consensual personal relationships and family relationships between employees are generally not the Township's concern. However, employees involved in such relationships that work as supervisor and subordinate must promptly inform the Clerk of the personal relationship, in order to allow the Township to consider taking action to change the reporting relationship between the individuals. A change in the working relationship of two employees involved in a personal or family relationship may be necessary to avoid partiality, a conflict of interest, or even the appearance of such.

Failure of an employee to give proper notice of such a relationship may result in the denial of legal representation and indemnification by the Township in the event that a lawsuit is filed in connection with the relationship.

Unless otherwise provided by the New Jersey Civil Service Commission or collective bargaining unit agreements, immediate relatives shall not be hired, promoted or transferred to a regular full-time or regular part-time position where:

- One relative would have the authority to appoint, remove, discipline or evaluate the performance of the other;
- One relative would be responsible for auditing the work of the other; or
- Other circumstances exist that place the relatives in a situation of actual or reasonably foreseeable conflict of interest.

# ORDINANCE NO. 2020-09 TOWNSHIP OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

For purposes of this policy, immediate relative includes spouse, civil union partner, domestic union partner, child, parent, stepchild, sibling, grandparents, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, grandchildren, niece, nephew, uncle, aunt, or any person related by blood or marriage residing in an employee's household.

# **SECTION 2 - SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

## **SECTION 3 - REPEALER**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety.

# **SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with law.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has determined that it is in the best interests of the Township to maintain a robust farmland preservation program, to continue to access funds from the SADC's Muni-PIG program, and any other programs that offer funding for farmland preservation, and to acquire as many farmland preservation easements from eligible farms, in partnership with the SADC and the County of Sussex, as possible; and

**WHEREAS,** Green Township's Agriculture Advisory Board recommends that the Township continue to participate in the SADC's Muni-PIG program;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey that it hereby authorizes ongoing participation in the SADC's Municipal Planning Incentive Grant program, as follows:

The Township approves the Muni-PIG renewal letter with attachments and authorizes the Agricultural Advisory Board and its consultant to submit the renewal application to SADC in advance of the December 15, 2020, deadline and to continue to work with farmland owners in the Township to develop applications to the program.

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Green desires to assist restaurants to extend Temporary Special Use Permits through March 31, 2021.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** the Green Township Committee, in the County of Sussex, in the State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. Temporary Special Use Permits shall continue to be available upon proper application to the Township Zoning Officer. The temporary period shall be until March 31, 2021, or longer if extended by the Township Committee.
- 2. If such Temporary Special Use Permit has been issued, and provided no changes have been made, such Permit shall be extended through March 31, 2021, or longer if extended by the Township Committee.
- 3. All terms or Township Resolution 2020-97 shall remain in effect, including compliance with all applicable Federal, State, County and Township orders and laws regarding outdoor dining and safety requirements, including social distancing and mask requirements.

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs ("DCA"), through the Division of Local Government Services ("DLGS" or "Division"), has been deemed the lead agency for the distribution of the Local Government Emergency Fund (the "LGEF" or "Program"), provided through an allocation of the State of New Jersey's CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF Funds); and

WHEREAS, counties and municipalities excluded from the federal government's direct CRF allocation plan, as well as those counties and municipalities that are currently the most impacted by COVID-19 in comparison to their available resources, are eligible for LGEF funds pursuant to a maximum distribution determined by formula; and

WHEREAS, a total of \$60 million is currently being made available under the Program, with a potential \$60 million more to be allocated; and

WHEREAS, LGEF Grants exist to support costs incurred as part of a local unit's response to COVID-19.
