MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY: Mr. Chirip stated that he has asked the Township Engineer to look into the new DEP and environmental regulations about the design of rivers and waters as C1. Restrictions are put in place if the rivers are trout producing. Green Township is not entered as C1. Mr. Chirip will confirm the official designation.

Mr. Qarmout stated that he is very proud of the young lady, Miss Costello representing Green Township. Mr. Qarmout has been hearing positive feedback concerning the upcoming paving projects.

Mrs. Raffay stated that she recently attended another municipality's meeting on a very hot topic and thanked the Township Attorney, Mrs. Leo, for the way she conducts herself at the Green Township Committee Meetings.

Mrs. Phillips feels the "No Knock" sign is quite large and asked if there could be a more reasonable size available. Mr. Zschack will look into. Mrs. Phillips stated that there is a big push for "clean" recyclables and learning what is appropriate recycling. This should be taken into consideration as the Township will be preparing to renegotiate a new contract for garbage and recycling.

Mayor Conkling commented that the Road Department is doing a tremendous job with the mowing of EverGreen Park. Mayor Conkling inquired about the timeline for the repair of potholes. Mayor Conkling asked about speed radar machine. Mr. Zschack is in the process of researching the cost. Mayor Conkling commented on the two big trees that are still down in by Wesley Field.

MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK: Mr. Zschack made the following comments:

- Municipal Appointment to Sussex County Solid Waste Advisory Council (SWAC) The Green Township position
 on SWAC is still vacant. With the current garbage contract expiring in March 2020 it could be important to have
 representation. Please submit names to the Mayor for consideration.
- Outstanding Older American Please submit names for consideration of the Outstanding Older American Award for 2019.
- Lake Tranquility Bridge The Township Engineer is looking to have specifications ready in early August and receive bids during the week of August 19th or 26th. An award can be made at the September 4th or 16th Committee meeting. The specifications will then state a completion date by October 30th.
- Road Resurfacing Projects Work on all projects within Green Township are scheduled to begin on Monday, July 22. Streets to be reconstructed include: Hibler Road, Terhune Road, Spruce Drive Birch Lane and the upper portion of Scenic Drive. The exact order of construction is yet to be determined but once the work begins Tilcon will remain in Green Township until all work is completed, approximately 6-7 days total.
- Elizabethtown's gas main extension in Andover has been pushed back two weeks and will start on or about July 24^{th.} This might push back the scheduled gas main extension on Lower White Hall Road.

Mrs. Fracasso asked about paying for the Lake Tranquility dam/bridge. Mayor Conkling explained that there has been a rusting problem under the bridge that was not supposed to occur. After lengthy discussions, the Township received a contribution from the former Township Engineer towards correcting the problem. Mrs. Fracasso commented that there is a tree limb hanging on wires on Kennedy Road just past the DPW entranceway. Mrs. Fracasso feels the traffic speed signs are not helpful in slowing cars down. Mrs. Fracasso asked what was decided about opening and closing the park gates. Mr. Zschack stated that when the contract is nearing expiration, the Committee will consider all the options. Mrs. Fracasso inquired about any decision made on the Trinca Airport property. Mayor Conkling explained that ideas have been received and the Committee is in the process of exploring options.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GREEN, SECTIONS 30-50.3 AND 30-82.18, TO PERMIT MEDICAL MARIJUANA GROWING, PRODUCTION AND MANUFACTURING AS A CONDITIONALLY PERMITTED USE IN THE AI-10 ZONE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green that Chapter 30 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Green, being the Zoning Chapter, shall be and is hereby amended to allow medical marijuana growing, production and manufacturing in the AI-10 Zone, as follows:

- **Section 1.** Section 30-50.3, Conditional Uses, shall be revised by addition of a new subparagraph 30-50.3(h) as follows:
- (h) Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing, in the AI-10 Zone only, subject to the requirements of Section 30-82.18.
- **Section 2.** A new Section 30-82.18, Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing shall be adopted as follows:
 - 30-82.18 Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing in the AI-10 Zone only
 - (a) Minimum lot size: Fifteen (15) acres
 - (b) Access and Setback: Access shall be provided via a driveway located on a County road, with all growing, production and/or manufacturing structures setback a minimum of four hundred (400') feet from the road.
 - (c) Landscaped Buffer: A minimum landscaped buffer at least one hundred (100') feet in width shall be established and maintained, adjacent to any County road. In addition, a landscaped buffer shall be required in the event that there is not a natural buffer between the property and any dwelling unit such natural buffer to be consistent with Township Ordinance 30-15(c)(5) and 30-17.3C, Landscape Standards;
 - (d) Fencing: All structures utilized for any growing, production or manufacturing shall be enclosed by a fence at least seven (7') feet high.
 - (e) Security: All structures shall be designed, using safety and security barriers, to prevent the unlawful and unauthorized entry into the structures.
 - a. 24-hour human security shall be provided on site.
 - b. There shall be no direct sales to the public from the property.
 - c. There shall be controlled access to the site, with on-site video monitoring.
 - (f) Maximum number of buildings: Ten (10). Each greenhouse shall be considered a separate building.
 - (g) Maximum building height: Thirty-five (35') feet
 - (h) Compliance: All growing, production and manufacturing shall be in compliance with all applicable New Jersey State requirements, licenses and permits. All medical

- marijuana grown shall cultivated organically.
- (i) Noise: All Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing operations shall operate in compliance with State and local noise laws and regulations.
- (j) Odor: All Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing operations shall utilize available technology to recirculate air, so that odors are not emitted outside of any structure(s).
- (k) Location: All Medical Marijuana Growing or manufacturing buildings shall be located at least four hundred (400') feet from the nearest dwelling, and a minimum of one thousand (1,000) feet from a school building.
- (l) AI-10 Zone Requirements: All newly constructed Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing structures shall abide by all setback and Code requirements in effect for the AI-10 Zone.
- (m) Generator: All Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing operations shall have a backup generator, which shall maintain all electronic security systems in the event of a power failure.
- (n) Signs: Medical Marijuana Growing, Production and Manufacturing operations shall only be permitted to have one sign, displaying the site address only, in compliance with sign requirements for the AI-10 Zone.
- (o) Lighting: No light generated by any Medical Marijuana Growing, Production or Manufacturing structures shall result in measurable light changes at the nearest property boundary to each structure. Interior light shades may be required by the Board on greenhouse structures to manage potential lighting impacts. Lighting shall be subject to a Township Engineer night lighting test.
- **Section 3.** Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such provision(s) shall be deemed severable and the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 4**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **Section 5.** The Township Clerk is directed to give notice at least ten days prior to the hearing on the adoption of this Ordinance to the County Planning Board and to all others entitled pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:55D-15. The Township Clerk is further directed to refer this Ordinance to the Township Land Use Board, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-64. Upon the adoption of this Ordinance, after public hearing, the Township Clerk is further directed to publish notice of the passage and to file a copy of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, with the Sussex County Planning Board, as required by N.J.S.A. 40:55D-16.
- **Section 6.** This Ordinance shall take effect after publication and passage according to law.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2019-06 of the Township of Green appropriated a total of \$305,000.00, with \$25,000.00 from the General Capital Fund Balance, \$208,000.00 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2019 Municipal Aid Program, and \$72,000.00 from the General Capital Reserves, for road improvements to Hibler Road; and

WHEREAS, The Township Committee has determined that Ordinance No. 2019-06 should be amended to appropriate an additional \$20,000.00 from the General Capital Fund Balance, thereby increasing the total appropriate amount from the General Capital Fund Balance to \$45,000.00 for road improvements to Hibler Road; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has attested to the availability of funds in the General Capital Fund Balance in an amount not to exceed \$45,000.00 for this purpose; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, in the County of Sussex, New Jersey as follows:

- 1. Ordinance 2019-06 is hereby amended to appropriate an additional \$20,000.00, for a total of \$45,000.00 from the General Capital Fund Balance for road improvements to Hibler Road.

AUTHORIZING PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY USE BY PLANET NETWORKS, INC. FOR FIBER OPTIC CABLING

WHEREAS, Planet Networks Inc. ("Planet Networks") is a provider of telecommunications services that is authorized by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Planet Networks has petitioned the Green Township for consent to use the public rights-of-way to place its telecommunication facilities, consisting of fiber optic cabling, aerially on existing and new utility poles and/or in underground conduit; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission has held that that "an effective prohibition [under the Telecommunications Act of 1996] occurs where a state or local legal requirement materially inhibits a provider's ability to engage in any of a variety of activities related to its provision of a covered service. . . not only by rendering a service provider unable to provide an existing service in a new geographic area or by restricting the entry of a new provider in providing service in a particular area, but also by materially inhibiting the introduction of new services or the improvement of existing services." Declaratory Ruling and Third Report and Order, WT Docket No. 17-79; WC Docket No. 17-84, FCC-18-133A1, at para. 36, p. 15-16; and

WHEREAS, Planet Networks has or will enter into agreements with the utility companies for the use of their poles; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 48:3-19 provides that "[t]he consent of the municipality shall be obtained for the use by a person of the poles of another person unless each person has a lawful right to maintain poles in such street, highway or other public place;" and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 27:16-6 provides, in part that "[t] he board of chosen freeholders shall not grant an easement, right of way, or use in, under or over, any portion of a county road in a municipality, unless the governing body of the municipality . . . shall consent thereto;" and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 46:17-8 provides that "[a]ny telegraph or telephone company organized under the laws of this or any other State, or of the United States may erect, construct and maintain the necessary poles, wires, conduits, and other fixtures for its lines, in, upon, along, over or under any public street, road or highway, upon first obtaining the consent in writing of the owner of the soil to the erection of such poles, and through, across or under any of the waters within this State and upon, through or over any other land, subject to the right of the owners thereof to full compensation for the same."; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey that Planet Networks, Inc. is granted non-exclusive use of the pubic right-of-ways for the purposes of allowing it to install fiber optic cables and pole-mounted cabinets on existing utility poles within the public right-of-way in the Township of Green and to install new utility poles, upon the following terms and conditions:

- a) Planet Networks shall adhere to all applicable federal, State, and local laws in connection with its use of the public rights-of-way;
- b) Planet Networks shall obtain any applicable permits in connection with the installation of its facilities;
- c) All new utility poles located in the public right-of-way shall be subject to Township Engineer approval prior to construction and shall be similar in appearance, composition, size and height as the closest existing utility poles located on either side of the proposed utility pole and shall, to the extent practical, be located at the property line between two properties;
- d) Planet Networks shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Township of Green, its officials, agents, and employees, from and against any claim of liability, damages or loss resulting in bodily injury or property damage arising out of Planet Network's use of the public right-of-way, except to the extent such loss, injury or property damage is proven to have resulted from the acts or omissions of the Township of Green;
- e) Planet Networks shall procure and maintain, at its cost and expense, commercial general liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 for injury to or death of one or more persons in any one occurrence and \$500,000 for damage or destruction to property in any one occurrence, and provide a current copy for the Township, and shall include the Township of Green as an additional insured on said insurance policy;
- f) Planet Networks shall provide an escrow of \$750.00 and reimburse the Township of Green for the actual cost of any services rendered by the Township or its professionals in connection with the granting of this consent and use of the public rights-of-way;

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 5-8.3 AND 9-4 OF THE GREEN TOWNSHIP CODE REGARDING DOGS AND PERMITTING LEASHED DOGS ALONG EVERGREEN TRAIL AND THE COUNTY CONNECTOR RAIL TO TRAIL

WHEREAS, the Green Township Committee has considered revisions to the Green Township Code to allow leashed dogs along EverGreen Trail and County Connector Rail to Trail in the Township of Green.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Sections 5-8.3 and 9.4 of the Code of the Township of Green are revised as follows:

SECTION 1.

Section 5-8.3 shall be revised to add the following:

Additionally, per Green Township Code Section 9-4, no dog, leashed or unleashed, shall be permitted to enter upon EverGreen Park or any of the fields, playgrounds, basketball or tennis courts within the Township of Green.

SECTION 2.

Section 9-4 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

9-4. Animals.

Except for certified guide or service dogs assisting their owner, no person shall bring, possess or harbor any pet or domestic animal of any nature on or into any Township facility, unless specifically set forth in this section.

Dog owners are required to remove all dog waste, and shall not deposit dog waste into Township and/or Park garbage receptacles.

Leashed dogs shall be permitted only along EverGreen Trail and County Connector Rail to Trail (and not at EverGreen Park or any of the Park fields), as long as such dog is accompanied by a person over the age of twelve (12) years and is controlled by an adequate leash or no more than six (6') feet in length, per Township Code Section 5-8.3.

SECTION 3 - SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4 - REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with law.

is not a current expense of the Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of the Township pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the total estimated cost of said purpose is \$100,000, and (4) \$5,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$95,000, and (6) the cost of said purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$25,000, which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of said purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$5,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$5,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of the Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$95,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter

determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of the Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$95,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance, shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law, and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of the Township and attested by the Township Clerk or Deputy Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in

such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance, and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of fifteen years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of the Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$95,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Sussex, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of said purpose shall be applied to the payment of the cost of said purpose or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes,

and the amount of bonds authorized for said purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Township intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 of this ordinance. If the Township incurs such costs prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes, the Township hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Township, and the Township shall levy ad <u>valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
