The Township Attorney recommended adding an additional paragraph "Whereas that Crossed Keys Estate is granted approval for a firework display on October 5, 2018, to be concluded by 10:30 p.m., so long as a NJ State Division of Fire Safety permit is provided to the Green Township Clerk's Office at least 48 hours before the planned fireworks."

MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY: Mrs. Phillips referenced the resolution in Correspondence adopted by Frankford supporting an increase in the Local Public Contract Law Bid Threshold. Mrs. Phillips recommended a similar resolution be considered for the next meeting.

Mr. Qarmout noted the resolution adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders expressing their opposition to the legalization of recreational marijuana by the State of New Jersey. Mr. Qarmout asked if anything can be done on the municipal level to oppose the use of recreational marijuana. Mayor Conkling commented to wait to see what the law is.

Mrs. Raffay attended the speech by Congressman Gottheimer. The speech was very well attended. A young man from Sussex County Community College was very impressive. Mrs. Raffay commented that the mosquito spraying caused a lot of chatter on social media. Mr. Zschack stated that this topic will be discussed during the Administrator's Report.

Mr. Chirip stated that he condemns the antisemitic graffiti that was inflicted on Hampton Township. Mr. Chirip stated that he received a phone call from a resident who received a phone call from the Zoning Official concerning shooting on their property. Mr. Chirip asked what the code law is enforcing on behalf the Township. Mr. Zschack stated that a resident complained about shooting. The Zoning Official inspected to make sure that a target or skeet business was not taking place. The Zoning Official found that the shooting was for personal use.

Mayor Conkling commended all involved with organizing and setting up Green Township Day. Mayor Conkling stated that he will check with the Township Attorney as well as the Land Use Attorney about the property that was approved for two uses, one as development, one as a solar farm. What is the time frame on these approvals? Mayor Conkling asked about the property that the Ag Committee was looking into. The Secretary has been trying to set up a meeting.

Mayor Conkling made the suggestion of keeping EverGreen Park open during the winter months. Residents can use the trail for cross country skiing, etc. Mr. Zschack will discuss with the Risk Manager.

MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK: Mr. Zschack noted the following matters:

Fire Department

The Green Fire Department has submitted a proposal for \$8,500.00 to have a fire alarm system installed in the firehouse. Since this project was listed on the November 3, 2017, budget request, it is eligible for the \$6,500.00 extra donation that the Township Committee approved. Once proof of payment is received we will reimburse.

Trinca Building

Mr. Perigo and Mr. Zschack have had numerous conversations lately concerning vehicle and equipment storage. With the recent and soon to be acquired purchases, the DPW needs more space. The solution is that we will take over the garage at Trinca Airport. A letter is drafted and will be sent out to the current lease providing the proper notice. This will free up the building on December 1st for the cold storage of equipment.

SWIFT 911

Mr. Mike Rose has informed us that the Township no longer needs to pay for the SWIFT 911 service. Sussex County has granted Green access to the system at no cost. The current contract will be canceled as of October 31st. Kudos to Mr. Rose for staying on top of this and generating a savings for the Township.

County Mosquito Spraying

The Sussex County scheduled mosquito spraying for today has been postponed. Mr. Zschack authorized Mr. Mike Rose to repost the County's notice on the Nextdoor Green Township website. This reopens the topic of how should the Township contact the public when an urgent matter exists.

A discussion ensued regarding use of social media when relaying emergency information to the residents. The Committee authorized a Subcommittee, Mayor Conkling and Mrs. Phillips, meet with the Township Attorney, Township Clerk and OEM Coordinator to determine the best way to communicate on social media.

MATTERS FROM THE MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENT HEAD: Mr. Perigo noted the roadside mower and the backhoe are in.

SUPPORT FOR THE JCP&L RELIABILITY PLUS

WHEREAS, the Township of Green recognizes that reliable electric service plays a crucial role in the daily lives of Town residents; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green recognizes that reliable electric service also is critical to the local businesses within our community, and drives commerce in our Town and across the region; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green supports efforts to enhance our energy infrastructure to continue to provide families and businesses the reliable source of energy they need; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green supports efforts to enhance the reliability and resiliency of the electric distribution system against severe weather and reduce the number of customers affected by outages and shorten the duration of outages; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green has been informed that Jersey Central Power and Light Company's (JCP&L) Reliability Plus includes approximately \$400 million in targeted investments above and beyond its regular annual investments to enhance JCP&L's service reliability and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green has been informed that the JCP&L plan includes nearly 4,000 enhancements that will help the reliability and resiliency of overhead and underground distribution lines, as well as new equipment to reduce the number of customers affected by outages and shorten the duration of outages; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green has been informed that the JCP&L plan also outlines additional vegetation management to reduce the potential for tree damage, which is the primary cause of outages during severe storms in JCP&L's service area.

WHEREAS, the Township of Green has been informed that JCP&L expects the plan's economic benefit to customers and businesses from enhanced reliability and resiliency will be \$1.9 billion over the estimated life of the equipment installed through the program; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Green has been informed that JCP&L estimates the initial increase on the monthly bill for an average residential customer would be about 25 cents.

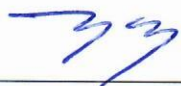

WHEREAS, Celebration Fireworks Inc. has submitted documentation in support of its request for the fireworks display; and

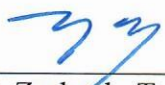
WHEREAS, the Green Township Committee is satisfied with the documentation provided, other than the State permit, and conditionally approves the firework request; and
