DISCUSSIONS:

- a. Trinca Airport - Mayor Conkling stated that the Township Committee has invited the Township Planner to discuss what the Township may be able to do with the airport property. Mrs. Phillips explained that the subcommittee has been discussing ideas to bring some tax relief to the residents. The Committee has requested the assistance from the Township Planner to explore different avenues. The Committee would like to keep township residents informed with the ability to voice opinions about what is being done.

Jessica Caldwell, Township Planner, explained that the Land Use Board is currently looking at the Master Plan examination. They started looking at the airport property and expansion of the commercial zone. Ms. Caldwell stated that if the property is kept as an airport, there are regulations with the airport safety zone with limited amount of development as well as height restrictions. Ms. Caldwell discussed some ideas for potential commercial uses.

Mr. Pete Sklannik, Trinca Airport Manager, spoke briefly about the history, advantages and disadvantages of keeping the airport and possible unfunded mandates from the FAA.

After the discussions, the Committee directed the Township Planner to draft Requests for Interest (RFI) for potential developers to be reviewed by the Township Committee prior to release.

Mayor Conkling asked about JCP&L disturbing land and soil erosion. Mr. Zschack stated that the Township Engineer has surveyed the areas cleared and is waiting for follow-up.

Mayor Conkling commented on the property on Willow Terrace that received Board of Health and Land Use variances. The Mayor would like to be sure that the Township Engineer is aware of the conditions of these approvals.

Mayor Conkling commented on the increase of speeders on Phillips Road. Mr. Zschack stated the State Police have been contacted and will send extra patrols in Green Township.

Mayor Conkling stated that the Open Space Advisory Committee will plan an official opening of the County Connector Trail at Green Township Day, September 22, 2018. Hayrides on the new trail will be provided by the Great Divide Campground. Mrs. Phillips has concerns with the turnaround at Creek Road. Mayor Conkling noted that someone will be at Creek Road to maintain safety. Mr. Zschack noted there are many concerns regarding liability that are being discussed with the Risk Manager.

MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY: Mrs. Leo noted no matters for discussion.

MATTERS FROM THE MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENT HEAD: Mr. Perigo stated the project at the Firehouse has begun. Mr. Perigo is working in conjunction with the Township Engineer.

Mayor Conkling asked the Road Department to fill some of the potholes around town.

Mrs. Josephine Fracasso, 111 Hibler Road, stated that she is in favor of not using the airport property as an airport. Mrs. Fracasso commented that if the property is sold for commercial use, the Township should consider they pay taxes from the beginning to benefit the residents.

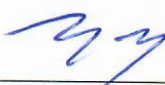

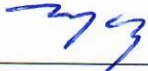

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-07

TOWNSHIP OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NJ

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 11 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GREEN ENTITLED "PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS AND CANVASSERS" TO REVISE THE CURRENT CODE AND TO ADOPT AND CREATE A NEW SECTION 11-8 ENTITLED "NO KNOCK LIST" TO PERMIT TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS TO REGISTER AND PROHIBIT SOLICITING ON THEIR PROPERTY AND AMEND CHAPTER 8 "FEES", SECTION 8-73 REGARDING PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS AND CANVASSER FEES

WHEREAS, Green Township regulates peddling and soliciting within the Township by and through Chapter 11 of the Code of the Township of Green; and

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to amend Section 11-2 "Application", Section 11-3 "Granting of Permit" and Section 11-4 "Regulations" to revise solicitation regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Township also wishes to add a new Section 11-8 entitled "No Knock List", providing Township residents with the option of registering for a "No Knock List."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, Sussex County, New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 11-2, "Application", Subsection b., is amended by adding the phrase, "and telephone number" to the end of the sentence.

SECTION 2. Section 11-2, "Application", Subsection f., is deleted in its entirety and replaced to read as follows:

- f. The names of at least two (2) reliable individuals who will certify as to the applicant's good character and business respectability, or, in lieu of the names of references, such other available evidence as to the good character and business responsibility of the applicant and his employer, as will enable an investigator to properly evaluate such character and business responsibility.

SECTION 3. Section 11-2, "Application", Subsection h., is deleted in its entirety and replaced to read as follows:

- h. Two (2) recent photographs of applicant(s) (so as to sufficiently portray the applicant's features substantially as they exist at the time of making the application) approximately one and one-half by one and one-half (1-1/2 x 1-1/2) inches in size.

SECTION 4. A new subsection O shall be added as follows:

- o. Proof of insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$100,000.00 per person/\$500,000.00 per occurrence for general liability and \$50,000.00 for property damage.

SECTION 5. Section 11-3, "Granting of Permit", second paragraph, is revised to read as follows:

A permit shall not be issued until receipt of fees as required by Chapter VIII. Each permit shall be valid for the period of thirty (30) days from the date of issuance.

SECTION 6. Section 11-4, "Regulations", Subsection d., is deleted in its entirety and replaced to read as follows:

- d. No person shall be permitted to peddle, solicit or canvass before 10:00 a.m. or 9:00pm on any day.

SECTION 7. A new Section 11-8, "No Knock List" shall be adopted to provide as follows:

- A. All the residents of the Township may register their name, address and/or unit/apartment number with the Township Clerk to be placed on the "No Knock List," indicating that they do not want peddlers of any sort to approach their homes and/or seek personal contact with the occupants of the registered home. The Township Clerk shall provide the registration form, which shall be available during normal business hours. By registering for the "No Knock List", the resident chooses to allow the Green Township Fire Department and Allamuchy-Green First Aid Squad to be exempt.
- B. Residents shall remain on the "No Knock List" until such time as they advise the Township Clerk in writing that they wish to be removed from the list.
- C. The Township Clerk shall maintain a "No Knock List", a copy of which shall be provided to all persons and organizations required to obtain a license or register pursuant to Chapter 11. The list shall be updated periodically.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to approach and/or seek personal contact with the occupants thereof if that residence is registered on the "No Knock List". Anyone violating this subsection shall be subject to a fine of not less than fifty (\$50) dollars nor more than one hundred (\$100) dollars for each violation.
- E. Upon completion of registration on the "No Knock List", the subscriber shall receive a decal stating "DO NOT KNOCK - Registered on the "No Knock List" with Green Township Clerk's Office - VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED", which must be displayed in a clearly visible location (i.e., front door or window adjacent to the front door).

SECTION 8. Chapter 8 "Fees", Section 8-73 "Peddlers, Solicitors and Canvassers" shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced to read as follows:

\$100.00

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

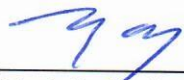
SECTION 10. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety.

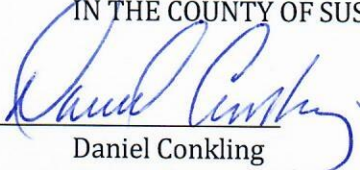
SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE

**CAPITAL ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$90,000.00
FROM THE GENERAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR
THE PURCHASE OF A NEW BACKHOE**

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: The Township Committee of the Township of Green hereby authorizes the purchase of a new backhoe in the amount, not to exceed, \$90,000.00, less applicable trade-in value of the backhoe currently in use by the Road Department. Said purchase is authorized utilizing the Sourcewell CO-OP (formerly National Joint Powers Alliance, NJPA) contract bid #032515-CNH. The Township Committee appropriates the sum of \$90,000.00 from the Township's General Capital Improvement Fund for the acquisition.

New Backhoe

TOTAL: \$90,000.00

SECTION 2: In connection with the amount authorized in Section 1 hereof, the Township makes the following determinations:

- 1) The purpose described in Section 1 hereof is not a Current Expense and is a purchase the Township of Green may lawfully make as a capital purchase.
- 2) The period of usefulness of the equipment described in Section 1 hereof is not in the limitation of said Local Bond law and according to the aggregate reasonable life thereof is five (5) years or longer.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance be and the same hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SECTION 4: This Capital Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, SWEAC has negotiated a new rate of \$0.0886 for a term of 22 months, effective March 2019; and
